Taking one or more of these courses means that the student will not have to take as many courses while at their post-secondary institution, meaning they will save some money in tuition and possibly speed up their process to earning their diplomas/degrees. Additionally, taking one of these courses is a great introduction to the academic level and type of work required of post-secondary students. Many of these courses will be transferable, so one does not necessarily need to attend the college that is offering one of the listed courses.

Course List - Prairie College (Three Hills, AB)

Course Code	Course Name	Course Details
OT 112	Reading the Torah	A study of the first five books of the Bible, focusing on the historical, literary, and theological features of these books, as well as establishing a strong grounding in Torah principles in preparation for interpreting the rest of Scripture.
NT 112	Reading the Gospel & Acts	In this course, students are introduced to the story of Jesus Christ and his earliest disciples as told by the four Gospels and the book of Acts. Students will grow in their understanding of who Jesus is as well as in their ability to interpret the Bible by attending to its literary, historical, and theological character.
TH 100	Introduction to Christian Theology	This course introduces students to the biblical, doctrinal, philosophical and historical “big picture” outlines of the Christian faith. The course aims to equip students with the skills to develop a Christian mind by assisting them in constructing a theological foundation for thinking and dealing with life’s most important issues. This course will also enable students to begin to think theologically and to construct a Christian worldview for the edification of the community of faith and to the glory of the almighty God whom we serve.
ST 100	The Christian Life	You will be challenged toward intentional pursuit of a love relationship with God as a faithful discipleship response to His person and work. The course content will explore a Christian spiritual theology and practice, not as a formula or recipe, but rather as a transformational relationship with the triune God in which you have both responsibilities and privileges. The course is designed to stretch beyond a cognitive/intellectual exercise so that you will be encouraged to actively engage in the whole-hearted pursuit of relationship with God, both inside and outside of the classroom. The anticipated result is that you will know God more

		deeply, relate to Him as one intimately known by Him, and desire to make Him known to others.
HF 111	Thinking and Writing	This course focuses on a critical examination of the many opposing views which will undoubtedly be encountered in the workplace and even in our churches. We are to critically engage with different but relevant viewpoints. Through proper and prayerful argumentation and thorough research, we are able to counter contrary positions using a variety of writing, skills to critically analyze a variety of resources helpful in research, components of a good argument useful in the apologetic task and the mechanics of writing. All assignments will be graded on content, spelling and grammar.
SS 170	Christianity in the 21st Century World	This course describes and analyzes the range and nature of Christian expression around the world. This will be done in three ways: 1) by briefly describing the four main streams of Christianity evident today; 2) by examining the variety of expressions of indigenous Christianity in the various geographical regions of the globe, and major challenges Christians face in each region; and 3) by getting a brief introduction or how Christianity spread from its Hebrew roots in Palestine to becoming a global faith which is known today as World Christianity (Christianity whose agenda is no longer determined by churches in the nations of the West). The underlying question for Christians living in the West is, 'What is our place and role in this recently altered global landscape of Christianity?' This course will offer some possible answers to that question.
IS 140	World Religions	A basic understanding of the beliefs, doctrines, and practices of the major world religions will allow Christians to be more effective in their witness for Christ in today's multicultural world. After a survey of the ideas, philosophy, doctrine, and major practices of the main religions we will discuss how our Gospel witness can be/should be contextualized to people from a particular world religion. We will not include Christianity or Judaism in our study.
BU 110	Introduction to Business Management	This course is intended to introduce and lay a foundation for the rest of our business program. Firstly then, students will develop practical competencies in management with the lens of Scripturally-grounded theology regarding God's view of work and in particular, the work of management. Biblical Management involves the skills, knowledge and character needed to lead a business (or any other organization) in ways that glorify God and fulfill His purposes. Students will be prepared for management through self-examination in light of biblical perspectives on topics like roles, motivation, conflict, competition, leadership and wealth.

Course Name	Course Details
American Sign Language - Part A	<p>In this course, students are introduced to American Sign Language (ASL), its culture, and the community of Deaf persons who use this language.</p> <p>Students learn how to have basic conversations as well as use appropriate behaviours within the Deaf Community.</p>
Basic Energy Principles	<p>A prerequisite course to all other courses in the Sustainability Energy certificate & diploma programs, this course provides students with an understanding of principles of energy systems, including electricity, heat, energy movement and water flow.</p>
Health, Safety and Nutrition	<p>This course examines the health, safety, and nutrition needs of young children. It includes practical applications for supporting these needs in an early childhood environment.</p>
Introduction to Esthetics	<p>This course will provide you with an overview of safe practices in the workplace regarding bacteriology and sanitation. You will learn to formulate a professional image and practice skills needed to work with the public.</p>
Observation and Play	<p>This course is an overview of the significance of play in the development of the child. It includes the nature and development of play in the environment and explores how early childhood educators co-construct meaningful play experiences with the child and their family. Special consideration is given to observing, designing responsive environments and focusing on children's natural disposition to learn in both indoor and outdoor play spaces.</p>
Occupational Skills and Apprentice Training	<p>This course provides the student with an overview of the requirements of a safe working environment in which to practice hairstyling. Topics in the program focus on general and personal safety, hygiene and infection control, understanding of provincial regulations and understanding of the professional ethics that should be practiced and adhered to in the hairstyling profession.</p>

ACT1011	Accounting Principles I	Introduces ethical financial accounting, focusing on the accounting cycle and the preparation of financial statements. Requires Math 10C minimum.
ATG1008	Solving Technology Problem	Builds hands-on technological skills by using coding, data analysis, Excel and robotics to solve real-world agricultural problems. Requires Math 10C minimum.
CEA1000	Fundamentals of Controlled Agriculture	Explores the technology behind Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA), including indoor growing systems, environmental controls and modern operational practices for high-tech farming.
EVS 1210	Applied Ecology	Introduces the fundamentals of ecology, from species to ecosystems, and how these principles are applied to sustainability and managing forests and grasslands.
HAT 1255	Global, Cultural, and Sustainable Tourism	Explores eco-tourism and sustainable tourism practices, focusing on rural, Indigenous and food-based experiences, while identifying opportunities for products and services in these areas.

ANH1510	Veterinary Medical Terminology	Explore the language of animal health used in real-world veterinary care. This course helps Students build essential skills for working in a team while learning key medical terminology for small, large and exotic companion species. Students gain experience applying terms across body systems — from musculoskeletal and cardiovascular to nervous and immune — preparing them for a confident start in animal health.
CEA1000	Fundamentals of Controlled Agriculture	Explores the technology behind Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA), including indoor growing systems, environmental controls and modern operational practices for high-tech farming.
COM1020	Workplace Communication	Strong communication skills are essential in every career. In this course, students develop practical writing and presentation skills for post-secondary studies and professional settings. They learn how to create clear, polished documents and deliver effective presentations using industry standards.
GIS1300	Introduction to GIS	Learn how to use Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to view, manage and analyze spatial data. This course provides hands-on experience with GIS software to create maps, perform analyses, and generate professional-quality reports. Students will develop key skills through Esri's ArcGIS Pro desktop software. Students must connect to Olds College Remote Computer Lab for software access. Math 10C or equivalent is recommended, and Students should be comfortable with coordinates systems, including latitude and longitude.
MGT1000	Principles of Management	Learn what it takes to be a successful manager. This course covers the core functions of management — planning, organizing, leading and controlling, while considering real-world challenges, including social and environmental pressures. Students practice leadership and decision-making skills in a simulated business situations.
